A **rain garden** is a special kind of landscaping with perennial flowers, shrubs, and/or small trees.

It is attractive – and it has a purpose: to help reduce flooding.

Up to 40 Mount Pleasant residents of Ramsay Terrace and nearby streets may be eligible to have one of these rain gardens installed in their yard for free.* These neighborhoods have been selected because they have historically had flooding problems.
